Abstract

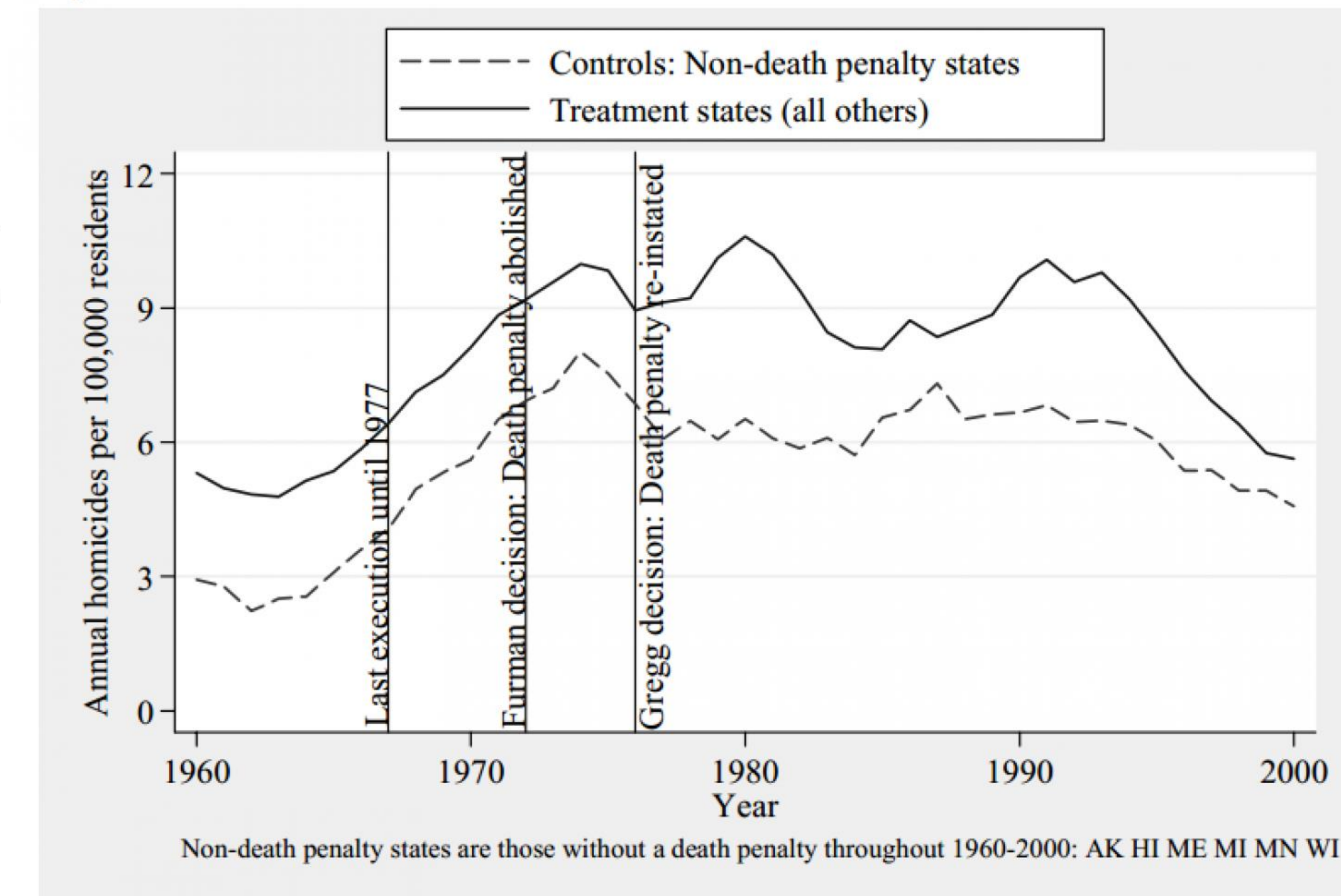

Conclusion

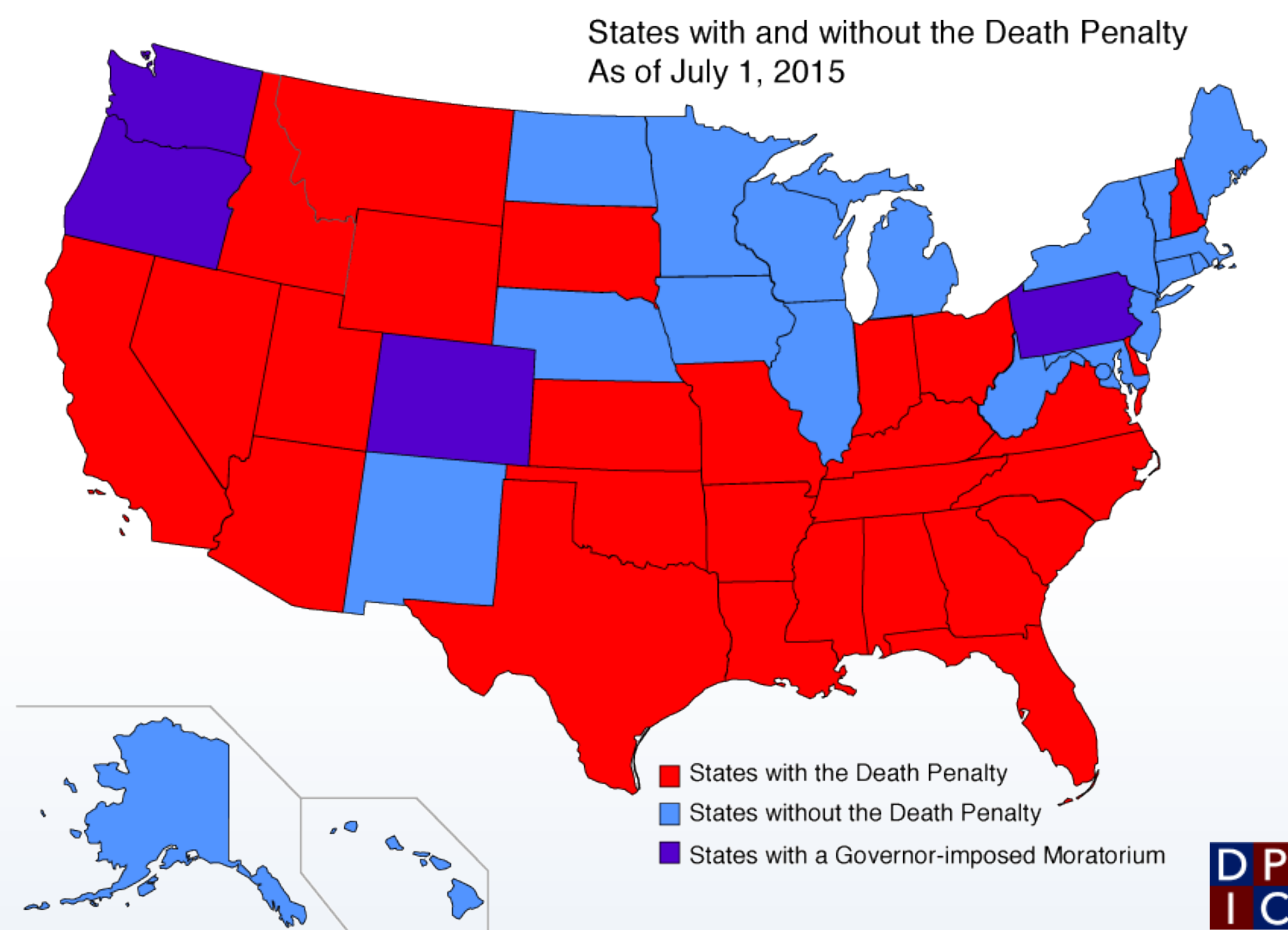

Introduction



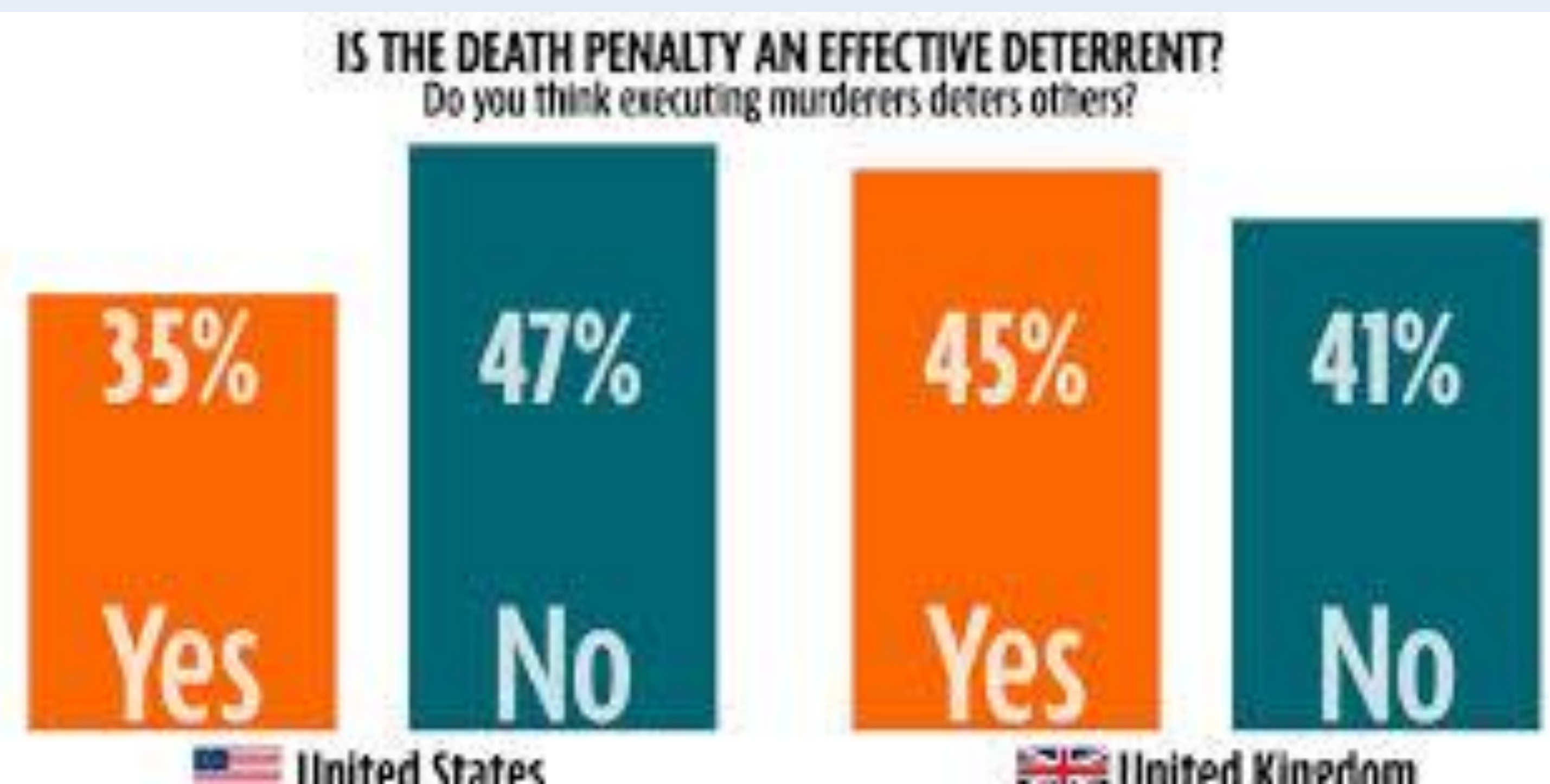
Participants
